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Meridian Releases Annual Data that Demonstrates an Increase in Acute Care Services and a 500% Increase in Telehealth Usage

Gainesville, Fla.- Meridian Behavioral Healthcare, Inc. releases the Resilience Edition of the organization's Annual Report to the Community for fiscal year July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020.

Data and the report is normally released during the annual board dinner which is an open annual meeting attended by partners, supporters, and interested community members each year in December. This year the meeting will be prerecorded and streamed virtually, on YouTube and Facebook, utilizing a lighthearted news story theme called **42 Minutes** as Meridian celebrates 42 years of serving North Central Florida.
